To preserve these natural materials, a few precautions are necessary.

Maintenance

How to clean varnished wood:

- **Dust removal:**
Clean the surface regularly with a soft cloth or feather duster to remove particles. Dust can scratch the surface over time.
- **Gentle cleaning:**
For regular cleaning, use a cloth slightly dampened with lukewarm water. Avoid using too much water, as prolonged contact with water can damage the varnish.
- **Cleaning products:**
If necessary, use a specific product for varnished wood. Be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions and do not use abrasive products that could damage the varnish.
- **Appropriate drying:**
After cleaning, dry the surface immediately with a clean, dry cloth to avoid water marks.
- **Preventive maintenance:**
Keep your varnished wood furniture away from sources of excessive humidity and extreme temperature variations.

How to clean brass:

- **Gentle cleaning:**

Utilisez un chiffon doux et propre pour nettoyer le laiton.

- **Avoid Abrasive Products:**

Do not use abrasive cleaning products, steel wool or hard-bristled brushes, as they may scratch the surface.

- **Proper drying:**

After cleaning, dry brass thoroughly to avoid water spots or marks.

How to clean the tabletop:

GLASS

- Use a glass cleaner and a soft cloth.

STRAW

- Use a glass cleaner and a soft cloth.
- Once a year, apply a neutral finishing wax.

Straw is only really susceptible to UV rays. Bright colors, if subjected to direct sunlight can fade or even change shade.

LAVA

- Use a sponge or a cloth.
- Soap or multi-purpose product, household alcohol or white vinegar

How to clean the tabletop:

FEATHER

- Use a glass cleaner and a soft cloth.

MOSAIC

- Use a dampened sponge or cloth. Avoid abrasive products.

CORD

- Use a glass cleaner and a soft cloth.
